SCAM ALERT!

The state's SMP program notifies us that the following scams are still alive and well.

- ✓ Calls to Medicare beneficiaries from scammers claim that a <u>new Medicare card is being issued,</u> but beneficiary must provide/verify their bank information.
- ✓ Grandparents still receiving calls from a scammer claiming their grandchild to be in trouble and needing money. They are told not to contact the child's parents and to wire money to a specific location.
- ✓ A company called GMY out of Atlanta, Georgia (866-680-0169) is calling seniors to get their bank account information in order to sign up for a medical savings card.
- ✓ Scammers posing as medical device representatives and promising <u>free medical alert systems.</u> They ask for money, personal and banking information to receive the medical alert.

We remind you that you should never give out personal information, social security information, bank account numbers, date of birth. The government rarely communicates via phone calls. Most often they use traditional snail mail. Don't count on caller- ID. Scammers know how to display another name or number!!

"BOX TOPS for EDUCATION"






